- Thirteen (13) groups used the Hughes Center during November for a total of 193 hours. Events included tax classes by Liberty Tax, the annual PACA arts and crafts gala and the Trout Day basic trout fishing clinic.
- For the month of November there were sixteen regular parties and four private parties at the aquatic center for a total of 44 hours. Class sessions were held for Try Scuba, Arkansas Tech University Beginner Swimming, Water Aerobics, Tone Zone, Silver Fins and Aqua Zumba for a total of 62 hours. Events in November included a Russellville High School swim meet and a private party for the Oak Grove Freewill Baptist Church.

- The annual inspection of the Department's fire extinguishers was conducted by Universal Fire. All of the extinguishers were tested, tagged and replaced as needed.
- The Department conducted meetings in November to organize the annual Christmas Parade. The parade is Thursday, December 6 at 6:30pm. The event brings the City together to kick off the holiday season.
- The Hughes Center Christmas decorations were put up in preparation for the season and the Christmas parties to be held at the Hughes Center.
- Maintenance worked many hours to decorate the Russellville downtown area for the holidays. The snowflakes were placed on the light poles and the lights from Winter Wonderland were installed in the area. We invite the public to come downtown and visit with the local proprietors and enjoy the holiday atmosphere.
- The annual PACA arts and crafts show was held on November 2 & 3 and was well attended. There was a wide variety of things to purchase and it was a good opportunity to pick up a Christmas present and visit with the vendors.
- Russellville High School swim team held a swim meet on November 9 at the aquatic center. There were eleven teams from Bentonville, Bentonville West, Siloam Springs, Fayetteville, Batesville, Cabot, Vilonia, Paris, Sylvan Hills, Pottsville and Russellville schools competing in the event. This was our largest swim meet this year. The meet had 280 swimmers and divers competing.
- Lyn's Tree Service trimmed several dangerous trees at Veterans Park. They also trimmed dead limbs off the large oak tree in City Park. The tree service will return to trim more weight off the tree once it goes dormant.
- The bathrooms at James Park, Shiloh Park, Vick Field and Hickey Park Fields 1 & 6 dugouts were winterized and closed for the winter. These bathrooms do not have a chaise way that can be heated so are more likely to freeze during cold weather.
- Fence work during November included building a new bullpen around the electric panel at the upper field in Shiloh Park and repair to fencing that was damaged during a storm at Hickey Park.
